





Second Informational Email

Dear Participant,

We are happy that you will join us for this year's Jewish Outdoor Escape! We have about one hundred people attending, with 33% male / 67% female & 30% CA / 70% US people attending the event this year. Approximately 74% of the attendees are "old friends" who have come to previous events, and 26% are fresh faces that we welcome! Your planning committee has worked hard to ensure you will have an enjoyable experience. Now, if we can have your attention, we would like to give you some essential information as you prepare for your trip.

Expect three to six informational emails over the next few weeks. We recommend you read them all from start to finish. Some of the emails -- packing list and driving directions, for instance -- we suggest you print out and put on top of your "going to camp" pile that you will soon be, no doubt, organizing. At the bottom of this email is a list of items you registered for. Do NOT ASSUME ANYTHING. Double-check to make sure your registration is correct. This includes if you registered for the Mosaic Shuttle.

Please make sure to finalize your choices by August 17th!!! Remember, we have instituted a change fee for registration changes after August 17th! Please see the "<u>Change Fee</u>" on our website for details. Many decisions are made based on the data we have at that time. Changes after August 17th cause us more work and you more money.
